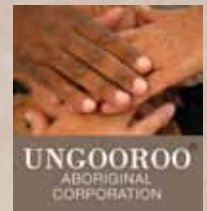

## WUPA@Wanaruah Art Exhibition for 2011 a HUGE SUCCESS!

This July from Monday 4th to Sunday 31st 2011, Ungooroo Aboriginal Corporation launched their annual cultural event, WUPA@WANARUAH®. The month long event showcased the original works of twelve Hunter Valley based Aboriginal artists.

“WUPA” is an Aboriginal word of the Wanaruah People of the Hunter Valley region. The word means ‘to make or to paint’, which is a fitting name. The Art Exhibition was an initiative of Ungooroo Aboriginal Corporation in Singleton who had the pleasure of working in conjunction with a number of venues to create an Aboriginal Art Trail that enabled visitors to weave their way through the beautiful wine region of the Hunter Valley. The group of local Aboriginal artists included

both experienced, award winning artists as well as a number of emerging artists who publicly showed their work for the first time.

The theme of the exhibition was “*The Valley and Beyond*”, and was chosen to highlight both the diversity of the Aboriginal people of the Hunter Valley and the styles of the individual artists themselves, who through their art tell the stories of their people and their culture through the use of traditional symbolism and colours.

### Successful tender for SHS program for the UPPER HUNTER at Ungooroo

Ungooroo Aboriginal Corporation has successfully secured funding under the new SHS program (specialist homelessness services).

We will be recruiting a new case worker under the program who will assist the community to address issues of youths 25 and under who are homeless or are at risk of homelessness under the guidelines of this 3 year program.

The service will be operating out of Ungooroo's shopfront office and will provide information and advice to people at risk of homelessness. We will endeavour to provide education programs eg life skills, budgeting and promote community awareness of homelessness and issues that relate to the problems.

We will assist with linkages to access services and skill development for the clients by providing assistance to access employment, education and training, health services, children's support services and accommodation.

speakers discussed local issues and brief the Elders of upcoming projects and strategies to deal with local issues.

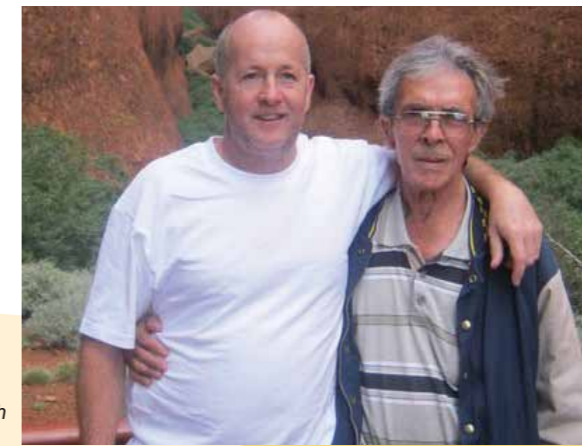
The next Elders Morning tea will be held on 2nd November 2011 at Ungooroo. Please feel free to come along and enjoy the association.

Ungoороо Aboriginal Corporation is a registered LandCare Group. LandCare is a national network of thousands of locally-based community groups who care for our country.

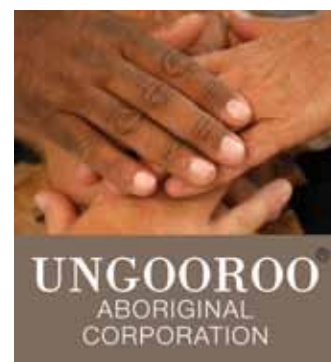


### Legal Aid
